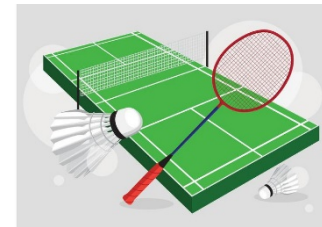
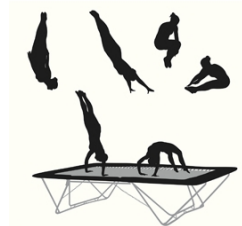

# OCR CAMBRIDGE NATIONALS LEVEL 1 & 2 IN SPORT STUDIES

The OCR Cambridge National in Sport Studies is an alternative qualification to GCSE PE or BTEC PE. It offers students the chance to develop a wide range of highly desirable, transferable skills through practical means. Cambridge Nationals deliver these skills and understanding, effectively engaging and inspiring students of all abilities to achieve. The Cambridge Nationals in Sport Studies take a more sector-based focus, whilst also encompassing some core sport/Physical Education themes. Students have the opportunity to apply theoretical knowledge about different types of sport and physical activity, skills development and sports leadership to their own practical performance. They will learn about contemporary issues in sport such as funding, participation, ethics and role models, and sport and the media. Students will develop an appreciation of the importance of sport locally and nationally, different ways of being involved in sport and of how this shapes the sports industry.

The course is broken down into 4 units which are all weighted equally.

## Unit R051

**Topic: Contemporary Issues in Sport**  
including; Participation, promoting values, major sporting events and national governing bodies,  
Assessment: 1hr Written Exam (60marks)

## Unit R053

**Topic: Sports Leadership**  
Assessment: Written assignments, planning sessions, leading sessions and a review.

## Unit R052

**Topic: Developing Sports Skills**  
Assessment: Practical performance in; 1 team activity, 1 individual activity and 1 officiating activity + a written review of performance.

## Unit R056

**Topic: Developing the knowledge and skills in outdoor activities**  
Assessment: Written and practical assessment in adventurous activities.
